The Medical Assisting program offers a sequence of courses that provides coherent and rigorous content aligned with challenging academic standards and relevant technical knowledge and skills needed to prepare for further education and careers in the Health Science career cluster, provides technical skill proficiency, and includes competency-based applied learning that contributes to the academic knowledge, higher-order reasoning and problem-solving skills, work attitudes, general employability skills, technical skills, and occupation-specific skills, and knowledge of all aspects of Health Science career cluster.

This program is designed to prepare students for employment as Medical Assistants SOC 31-9092.

The content includes but is not limited to communication, transcultural communication in healthcare, interpersonal skills, legal and ethical responsibilities, health-illness concepts, administrative and clinical duties, emergency procedures including CPR and first aid, emergency preparedness, safety and security procedures, medical terminology, anatomy and physiology, and employability skills.

### **Licensure/Certification**

A certificate of completion is awarded to a student upon successful completion of all program requirements including satisfying the TABE requirement. The student is prepared to sit for the certification exam for Registered Assistant through American Medical Technologists and the fees for practice exam costs are included in the cost of the program. Having this certification upon completion of a program enables the student to be uniquely prepared for employment.
